TOPIC: Wildlife Photography

Jason George, wildlife photographer, will be take you on a trip around the world to see your favourite animals that he has photographed in the wild. Lions, squirrels, cheetahs, foxes, moose and even snow leopards plus a bunch more. There will be a interactive session and a q&a for those in attendance to the presentation. You will laugh, and be shocked by the pictures and the stories that Jason shares.

Jason George is a wildlife photographer, presenter, and writer that recently relocated to the settings of Wasaga Beach to get closer to nature when he retired from teaching full-time his passion for wildlife. He loves to see wild animals in their natural habitat and state, so travels around Canada (missing only Newfoundland and Nunavut) and the world (missing Antarctica). Getting to see an animal in its habitat is special, being able to photograph it is awesome. Luckily, he has seen more than 70% of the animals you could see in the zoo, in wild. He now explores ways to share his love and passion with those not able to have these experiences.

Jason recently released a solo book series "Going Deeper with Jason George" – Red Foxes, Moose, Cheetah, Penguin, Owls, Leopards & Snow Leopards, and Lions with personal stories, lots of photos, and even colouring pages of select images in the book, which link videos on his YouTube channel. He has a different book series Jay and Kay about their experiences with learning disabilities and just released a 3-game educational app to learn visit www.jayandkay.ca Don't forget about the 1st wildlife series "The World with Jason George" – Canada (French & English) and Africa.

Jason seems to have a magical connection with animals which helps him capture these mazing natural pictures (both ethically and humanely). He gets the best pictures of the animals without hurting or baiting them.
